Please note that as a result of the Competence by Design (CBD) initiative, there are now two sets of standards documents on the Information by Discipline webpages for Anesthesiology and Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery (Oto-HNS):

- 1. National standards for residents whose training started prior to July 1, 2017
- 2. National standards (CBD) for residents whose training started on or after July 2017

These two sets of standards will remain accessible on the Royal College website until such time that all trainees have transitioned to CBD.

	identify if a resident is qualified to sit the certification	
	exam in anticipation of being able to proceed to	
	independent practice.

EPAs – Entrustable professional activities: EPAs are clinical tasks that a supervisor delegates to a resident once the trainee has demonstrated sufficient competence, or, in the context of a practicing physician, tasks that may be performed autonomously once sufficient competence has been demonstrated. Achievement of the EPAs of the discipline is required for certification.	Available to Specialty Committee members and Program Leadership via secure site
Milestones: The expected ability of a health care professional at a stage of expertise.	Available to Specialty Committee members and Program Leadership via secure site
Pathway document: The Pathway to Competence document illustrates the progression of a resident's competence through four stages of training in a given discipline or special program. The pathway identifies milestones (both generic and discipline-specific) that the resident must acquire in order to attain the exit competencies outlined in the Discipline Competencies.
